2. Important considerations

- a. Most churches throughout history have more than one ordained pastor Acts 14:23; 15:23; 16:4; 20:17; Titus 1:5; Phil. 1:1
 - These character qualities are a *must* for all ordained pastors, not just the lead or senior pastor
- b. No pastor can work these character qualities out perfectly Is. 35:4; Pr. 27:9, 17; Ro. 7:18-19, 24-25; 8:8; 2 Ti. 1:8; 2:13; Heb. 10:24; James 1:2; 1 Peter 4:12-13
 - Nonetheless, he must do all he can to achieve them
 - He must always examine and evaluate his life
 - He must always be challenged and growing in his faith and work
 - He must have a multitude of counsellors that will constructively challenge and help him
 - He must always stay close to the Lord in prayer, Bible reading and study
 - He must always do his very best for the Lord and the local church
