			Forgiving fellow believers for personal wrongs or insults			
			Giving fellow believers the benefit of the doubt			
			Giving people a second chance, or three or four			
			Helping others that don't necessarily deserve it			
			Being gracious to others, especially to those that don't deserve it			
			Loving the unlovely, unpopular, outcast or outsider
