The man that fulfills these things is counted to be \_\_\_\_\_\_ of double honour

Double honour here is defined as financial pay (a double amount of respect is also applicable)

Not every church can afford double pay based on geography, culture, or present circumstances

If a church can afford it, he is worthy of this extra compensation

Ruling well and labouring in the word and doctrine takes an inordinate amount of extra time

He knows how much time and effort is involved so he determines his rate of extra pay

## 2. Disciplining a pastor – 1 Timothy 5:19-21

- a. No one is to \_\_\_\_\_ an accusation against a pastor unless...
  - Collaborated by two or three [reliable] witnesses in his presence
  - Always give him the benefit of the doubt before hearing the full story
- b. If the guilty party is caught in a provable sin with two or three witnesses...
  - Rebuke him before the entire church

It would seem to me to require some type of special meeting beforehand with deacons and the other pastors to agree on exactly how and when to handle the issue \_\_\_\_\_

When this is made public it would certainly cause the simple to beware - Prov. 19:25

He may be asked to resign or he may be reinstated... the scripture is open-ended

This procedure also includes his accusers if they are proven to be false witnesses

- When doing this you had better \_\_\_\_\_ show partiality to any one man

Whether or not he is your long-time friend or someone you have personal issues with, treat everyone with the same fairness and judgmental spirit

This is obviously a serious matter as we are charged to observe it before God, and the Lord Jesus Christ, and the elect angels
