- The husband of one wife
- Vigilant
- Sober
- Of good behaviour
- Given to hospitality
- Apt to teach
- Not given to [much] wine
- No striker
- Not greedy of filthy lucre
- Patient
- Not a brawler
- Not covetous
- One that ruleth well his own house, having his children in subjection with all gravity
- Not a novice
- Having a good report of them which are without
- Grave
- Not double-tongued
- Holding the mystery of the faith in a pure conscience
- Proven

Wives must be grave, not slanderers, sober, faithful in all things

		A: From within the membership of local churches found in every city	
	b.	Deacons – Acts 6:1-7	
		- Look ye out among you	
		Q: From where do you get the deacons of local churches?	
		A: From within the membership of local churches	
	c.	Their wives – 1 Timothy 3:11	
		- Faithful in all things	
	d.	The mission and purpose of every believer and every local church	
		- Our purpose is to bring glory to God – Ro. 15:5-9; 1 Cor. 6:19-20; 10:32; Eph. 3:21	
		- Every believer is an ambassador and minister – 1 Cor. 4:1-2; 2 Cor. 5:20a	
	e.	God's great love for us – Eph. 2:4-10	
		- We reciprocate with our love toward him – Jo. 14:15; 15:14	
		God desires a close personal relationship with every person, especially those that believe Through our intimacy with him we will bear fruit As a result, we are in a close love relationship with God
