The context is the sound _____ of God found in Paul's epistles and the entirety of scripture

b. Keep preaching and teaching the sound words of God – verse 14b

- These words bring forth new life – Ro. 10:17; 1 Cor. 15:1-4; Eph. 2:8-9; James 1:21; 1 Peter 1:23-25
- These words will keep you _____ to please God – Ps. 119:9-11; Jo. 15:3
- These words will sustain you in your daily Christian life – Job 23:12; Ps.119:103; Jer. 15:16; Lk. 4:4; 1 Cor. 3:1-2; 1 Peter 2:2
- These words equip you for service – Eph. 6:10-18; 2 Ti. 3:16-17
- Remember that God created the entire universe by his spoken words – Gen. 1:3; Ps. 33:6; Heb. 11:3
- The Holy Ghost is the actual author as he moved (_____) holy men of God to speak sound words (and ultimately write them down) – 2 Peter 1:21

c. A famous quote concerning the sound words of God:

Here paradise is restored, heaven opened and the gates of hell disclosed. Christ is its grand subject, our good its design and the glory of God its end. It should fill the memory, rule the heart and guide the feet.

Read it slowly, frequently, prayerfully. It is a mine of wealth, a paradise of glory and a river of pleasure. It is given to you in life, will be opened at the judgment and remembered forever. It involves the highest responsibility, rewards the greatest labor and condemns all who trifle with its holy contents.”
