## Keep the Way of the Lord

For I know him, that he will command his children and his household after him, and they shall keep the way of the LORD, to do justice and judgment; that the LORD may bring upon Abraham that which he hath spoken of him.

In our study of the book of Jude thus far, we all have been faithfully challenged to earnestly contend for the faith which was once delivered unto the saints because there are certain men that have crept in unawares to counter, counterfeit, and confound the work of God (Jude 1:3-4).
