JOHN'S MIRACULOUS JOURNEY - REVELATION 1:9-20


So far in our exposition of Revelation 1 we have seen important points necessary to comprehend the book (verses 1-6) and the theme (verses 7-8). Today's closing text reveals several more things: the apostle John's through time and space, the key to rightly the book, and an extraordinary, detailed of its central character in all his glory.
