



CHRIST OUR PASSOVER SACRIFICE

1 Corinthians 5:7

The holiday referred to and observed as Easter is primarily connected to the Jewish _____ because the Biblical events of Christ's death and resurrection occurred during that same time. Jesus' last supper with his disciples was a Passover Sedar. As the scriptural record shows, shortly thereafter he was crucified, buried, and resurrected (with all events taking place within the Passover festival that same year). For this reason the common date for Easter usually takes place at or near the observance of that Jewish ordinance. Today we will see the origin of the Passover feast and its likeness to our ordinance called _____.

1- Jesus is our Passover Lamb – 1 Cor. 5:7

- The perfect complete _____ (Christ alone, plus nothing minus nothing)

2- The New Testament – Communion, The Lord's Supper, The Lord's Table – Lk. 22:14-20

- Unleavened bread – represents the sinless body of Jesus Christ, _____ for our freedom from the *leaven* of sin
- The Cup – A symbol for the blood of the new testament, shed for the total _____ of sins...

3- The Passover – Ex. 12:1-14

- Judgment passed over where blood was applied—no blood meant death
