

## Chapters 4-5 – The Rapture and Events Taking Place at the Throne of God

## WHEN WE ALL GET TO HEAVEN - REVELATION 4-5

Our studies in the section of Revelation (Chapters 1-3) have brought us up to the conclusion of the church age, which was represented by the seven letters to the seven churches of Chapters 2-3.
Chapter 4 brings us to the section of Revelation (Chapters 4-19:10), initiated by the <i>open</i>
door of verse one. This is the first time in the book that a door opens in heaven with someone going up.
(The section begins in Chapter 19:11 when someone comes down – see attached addendums).
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The terms "after this" and "hereafter" indicate events that will take place the church age is
complete—after Rev. 3:22 the <i>church</i> is mentioned again by name until Chapter 22:16. This
should be obvious because we are gone. What we are about to read in Chapters 4-5 describe the rapture
of age saints and events taking place at the throne of God, things we will experience
firsthand when we all get to heaven.
1. Understanding the text of Chapter 4
a. The throne of God – Revelation 4:1-8
- A rapture to the – verses 1-2
The very first thing he sees is the throne of God
- The one seated on the throne – verse 3a
Jehovah, God the Father – He was to look upon a jasper and a sardine stone – John 1:5; 1 Timothy 6:16; Ps. 104:2; Rev. 3:1; 21:10-11
- Things surrounding the throne – verses 3b-4
A rainbow – like an
24 elders – with white raiment and crowns of gold on their heads
- Things proceeding out of and before the throne – verses 5-6a
Lightnings, and thunderings, and voices
Seven lamps of fire which are the seven Spirits of God – Isaiah 11:2
1) The Spirit of the Lord
2) The Spirit of Wisdom
3) The Spirit of Understanding
4) The Spirit of Council
5) The Spirit of Might
6) The Spirit of Knowledge
7) The Spirit of the Fear of the Lord



A sea of glass, like crystal – Gen. 1:6-9; Job 9:5-9; 26:7-10; 37:14-38:11; 38:30; 41:31-32; Ps. 104:2-3; 148:4; Pr. 30:4

- Things in the midst of the throne – verses 6b-8

Four beasts full of eyes – they are cherubim, signifying all that is supreme in creation on earth and in heaven – Ezek. 1:10; 10:14-22; 28:14

Lion – king of the wild beasts Calf/Ox – king of domestic beasts Man – ruler of earth's economies Eagle – king of the skies

- b. The worship of God Revelation 4:9-11
  - The praises to God

The beasts give glory and honor, and thanks...

The elders fall prostrate casting their crowns before the throne saying:

Thou art worthy, O Lord, to receive glory and honour and power: for thou hast created all things, and for thy pleasure they are and were created.

    - It includes everyone present:


The four beasts, the 24 elders, the angels, unnumerable saints, and every creature present
