

Chapters 8-11 - The Second Journey Through the Tribulation Period

SEVEN ANGELS WITH SEVEN TRUMPETS - PART ONE - REVELATION 8:1-6

- 1. The silence Rev. 8:1
 - a. Silence in the Bible Is. 41:1; Hab. 2:20; Zeph. 1:7, 14-18; Zech. 2:13
 - Silence signifies a dramatic interlude before judgment comes
 Silence reflects the awe of the profound awesomeness of God's supreme power and holiness
 - b. Silence in heaven verse 1
 - This silence is the calm before the storm
 - This silent time frame (about the space of half an hour) is _____ symbolic or figurative, nor
 is it a dream or vision. It demonstrates that John is present, witnessing this event in real time
- 2. The supplication Rev. 8:2-4
 - a. Seven angels with seven trumpets verse 2
