

Chapter 1 – Jesus Christ's Pattern as Prophet, Priest, & King – Addendum 11

FOLLOWING AFTER CHRIST AS PROPHETS, PRIESTS, AND KINGS - REVELATION 1:5-6

We began our study of Revelation by working through church history which ends in chapter 3 with the failure of this Laodicean church age. We then observed the upcoming rapture of the church at the beginning of chapter 4 leading into the incredible and yet terrifying Judgment Seat of Christ. We learned at this judgment that every believer will give a personal account as a steward and minister of God. We saw how all our works done after salvation will be tried by fire as either done in/for the flesh (*wood, hay, stubble*) OR having been built upon the foundation of Jesus Christ (*gold, silver, precious stones*); though we ourselves shall be *saved yet so as by fire*. The outcome of this purification process will determine our crowns, rewards, and inheritance. 	-	Historically: King David was anointed three times - first by Samuel being chosen of God (I Sam. 16:13); second willingly by Judah (II Sam. 2:4); third by all of Israel (II Sam. 5:3)	
	-	Devotionally: Jesus Christ was anointed by God (Ps. 2:2; Lk. 3:21-22); he is anointed by believers - Kingdom of God (Lk. 17:21); he is anointed to reign in his future kingdom of Heaven (Lk. 1:31-33)	
	-	1st Coming - anointed by God and called a king but rejected as king over all - Jn. 1:11; 18:33-19:22

	-	Some requirements of a biblical king: chosen by God; does not seek to multiply women, wealth, or the worldly things; required to study, learn, obey, and write out scripture; fears God; servant-leader; humble; leads family by example, etc Dt. 17:14-20
