Chapters 8-11 – The *Second* Journey Through the Tribulation Period

THY KINGDOM COME - THY WILL BE DONE – REVELATION 11:15-19

Today we close out our study of Revelation 11, one of the most _____ chapters in the entire Bible as it concerns *end times* understanding. Here God reminds us that we are once again concluding another trip through the tribulation period. We know this is true because of the subject matter found in verses 15-19 and in particular the statement: *“The kingdoms of this world have become the kingdoms of our Lord, and of his Christ; and he shall reign for ever and ever.”*

As if things during the tribulation have not been bad enough, the sounding of this _____ judgment with the _____ coming quickly (verse 15) ushers in the most horrific scene the lost unrepentant world will witness: The second coming of the Lord Jesus Christ (as the Lion of the tribe of Juda – Rev. 5:5). For the lost this will be a frightful sight. For those who know him it will be the rejoicing of their heart.

1. Thy kingdom come – verses 15-17

a. This is the second time in Revelation that we have been told of the King and his coming kingdom

This second climactic conclusion was forewarned in Rev. 10:7

b. This passage describes the forcible takeover of the nations by Jesus Christ

- The “kingdoms of _____”

1) This includes all four hemispheres and all seven continents... the countries and nations of Africa, the nations and settlements located on Antarctica and the Arctic Circle regions, all the various countries of Asia including China and India, Australia and New Zealand, the Caribbean Islands, all Central American nations, every single existing European nation, Israel, all the Muslim Middle Eastern countries, all of North America which includes Canada and the USA with all provinces, each and every Pacific Island country (what Islands are left that have not sunk into the sea), and every nation located in South America and its coasts. It also includes all banking and commerce, judicial rules, remaining militaries, security, law enforcement and policing activity, along with the replacement of all constitutions with Matthew 5-7. It encompasses the takeover of every single kingdom on earth and replacing them with the _____ of _____.

Note: All these kingdoms will have to be _____ forcibly by Christ – Mt. 4:8-9; Lk. 4:5-7

2) This term “kingdoms” has a dual meaning. It includes both the physical and _____ kingdoms. At this time the kingdom of heaven and the kingdom of _____ are united as they were originally intended to be. (Both are understood by the word *kingdoms*).

Note: The *physical kingdom of heaven* will be realized through the restoration of the nation of Israel, who will be the ruling superpower nation throughout the millennium. The *spiritual kingdom of God* will be administrated by the body of Christ in our glorified eternal bodies, reigning and ruling with Jesus in the physical kingdom.
